Supreme Court's Rejection of Tamil Nadu's Plea on Mekedatu is Justice for Karnataka: DCM DK Shivakumar

Bengaluru, November 13, 2025: Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar hailed the Supreme Court's rejection of Tamil Nadu's plea against the Mekedatu project as a moment of justice for Karnataka. Addressing the media at Vidhana Soudha, he said the verdict reinforces Karnataka's right to utilize its resources responsibly while ensuring fair water sharing with Tamil Nadu.



"This is not about victory or defeat — it is about justice. Mekedatu is a project for our water needs and does not harm Tamil Nadu in any way; in fact, it benefits them," Shivakumar stated. He added that the project would help ensure Tamil Nadu receives its share of water as per tribunal and court directives, even in years of low rainfall. Calling Mekedatu vital for Bengaluru's drinking water supply,

Shivakumar emphasized that the project is being developed on Karnataka's land and with its resources. "This is a victory for the people of Bengaluru and Karnataka. I appeal to Tamil Nadu to extend cooperation so that we can work together," he urged.

Responding to questions about Central Water Commission (CWC) approval, the Deputy CM said, "The Court will guide the CWC, and it has no option but to cooperate with the project."

Minister Ramalinga Reddy encouraged the employees by playing shuttle badminton, carom, chess and table tennis, while launching the sports competition

Yesterday, a bomb blast took place in a car near the Red Fort in New Delhi, which he said was a terrorist attack. Home Minister Amit Shah ji immediately visited the spot. The next day, Prime Minister Narendra Modi ji also visit-

ed the hospitals. He said that it has been revealed that important places like Parliament House, BJP Central Office, Air Force Office, Sena Bhavan were on the target list.

Tunnel road decision is a bluff: P.C. Mohan

Bengaluru: MP P.C. Mohan has objected that Even though the state government does not have the money to close the potholes in Bengaluru, it is going ahead with the bluff of building two tunnel roads. This is unfortunate. Speaking at a press conference at the BJP state office Jagannath Bhavan, he said that a tender was called and technical bids were opened in this regard yesterday. An 18 km tunnel road is being built from Esteem Mall to St. John's Medical College in Madiwala. The entry and exit points are 15 km each, making this a total of 33 km



tunnel road. He said that this is a tunnel that is 30 to 40 meters, i.e. 130 to 140 feet below the ground. Coming from Hebbal, there will be an exit at Mekhri Circle, one exit each at Racecourse, Lalbagh, and then at the end there will be an exit at St. John's Medical College. He criticized that no traffic congestion study was conducted; entry and exit points were given if there was empty space.
